Executive Summary

This paper seeks the approval of the Police and Crime Commissioner to enter into a collaboration agreement for the provision of Specialist Estates Management Services for the period 1st July 2014 to 30th June 2019

PART I

1. Background and Advice

The 2013 Business Support Review disestablished the posts of Principal Estates Surveyor and Environmental and Energy Manager and recognised that a more collaborative approach with Lancashire County Council would be beneficial.

Although the Collaboration Agreement was embarked upon to achieve resilience and support for Estates in these specific roles, the Agreement is not restrictive to only these areas, it could supply services for all Estates Management functions when required and to provide resilience and support during periods of staff absences and potentially other review recommendations.

The Collaboration Agreement was prepared in 2014 in consultation with the OPCC and considered by the Constabulary's Strategic Management Board in July of that year. Since then both Lancashire Constabulary and Lancashire County Council have been operating in accordance with this agreement and retrospective agreement is now being sought from the Police and Crime Commissioner to enter into a collaboration agreement for the provision of Specialist Estates Management Services for the period 1st July 2014 to 30th June 2019.

2.1. The collaboration agreement will ensure the Constabulary has adequate capacity to deliver against the Police and Crime plan priorities and meet its obligations in relation to the management of the Commissioner's estate.
