<p>Executive Summary</p> <p>Modern Slavery Week of Action commences 17 October 2016</p> <p>Insp James – committed member of Joint Modern Day Slavery and Sex Worker meeting is holding an event for the hoteliers at Blackpool to raise awareness and encourage them to spot the signs.</p> <p>This is a follow up event from the 5 x sessions of Modern Day Slavery that captured 250 individuals from a multi agency background</p>
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<p>Recommendation</p> <p>That the Commissioner consider and approve the payment for the services of Hope For Justice to deliver this training. You are opening the event and it gives a consistent message from the previous training given earlier this year to a multi agency audience</p>

In discussions with Insp James Martin at Blackpool he attended one of our training sessions this year and is proactively working with the Modern Slavery team at East on gathering intelligence and encouraging submissions. He recognises that Blackpool has a large number of transient individuals and the hoteliers are key to spotting the 'unusual'. He has provisionally verbally requested the services of the Police and Crime Commissioner to open the event and demonstrate the commitment that is across Lancashire in sending out this important message.

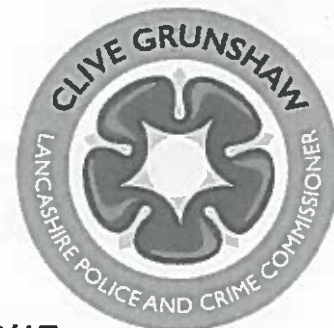
