<b>AREA:</b>	Blackpool Victoria & Bloomfield Ward	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime and reoffending.
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,000	<b>Match Funds:</b>	None.
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Skool of Street Arts & Confidence Building Programme £2,000		
<b>Summary:</b>	Skool of Streets will deliver urban performing arts sessions to 50 young people in the Victoria and Bloomfield Wards of Blackpool. Skool of Street will give young people the opportunity to learn new skills such as breakdancing and song writing through delivered workshops taking place on a Saturday evening for 10 weeks which will result in a showcase for family and friends.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,000</b> is provided to Skool of Street.

<b>AREA:</b>	Lancaster	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime and reoffending & Supporting vulnerable people.
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,374	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Lancashire Initiative Fund, YPS: Wellbeing, Prevention and Early Help Service and the Galbraith Trust.
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	EASY Project £9,822		
<b>Summary:</b>	<p>The EASY Programme provides 1-2-1 therapeutic and practical support to engage specifically with young people who may benefit from wellbeing, early intervention and prevention support but</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• do not meet the threshold for statutory intervention; and/or</li> <li>• are experiencing excessive waiting times; and/or</li> <li>• are unwilling/unable to engage with child and adolescent mental health agencies.</li> </ul> <p>The primary aim of the project is to reduce potential exclusion, isolation and offending.</p>		
<b>Comments:</b>	<p>The EASY Project was piloted in 2015 through Lancaster CSP PCC Funding and received positive feedback. Support from the Community Action Fund would allow the programme to run for 11 months.</p>		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner.</li> <li>2. That a grant of £2,374 is provided to Strawberry Fields for the Easy Project.</li> </ol>

<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,170	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources.
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	In a Flash £1,170		
<b>Summary:</b>	<p>The Artz Centre will work with 20 vulnerable young people through a 6 week programme that will explore social media and positive body image. The youngsters will take part in photography sessions developing their own material to showcase at a Gallery Style Evening which will be open to the community.</p>		
<b>Comments:</b>	<p>Sexual Offences which includes sexting is one of the priorities identified in West Lancs CSP Plan 2016-2019.</p>		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner.</li> <li>2. That a grant of £1,710 is provided to the Artz Centre for the In a Flash project.</li> </ol>		

<b>4. NAME:</b>	Blackpool Musical School		
<b>AREA:</b>	Blackpool	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle crime and reoffending.
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Fundraising and organisations own resources.
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Do you want to be a rock star £5,418		
<b>Summary:</b>	Blackpool Musical School work with vulnerable young people at the risk of offending. Blackpool Music School will offer young people the opportunity to take up a new activity and learn new skills through one to one and group sessions over a 42 week music programme.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Blackpool Music School work in partnership with the Princes Trust and the Commissioner funded Blackpool Musical School through the Community Action Fund in September 2016 which received positive feedback.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> to Blackpool Musical School.		

<b>5. NAME:</b>	The Rotary Club of Fleetwood		
<b>AREA:</b>	Wyre	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle crime and reoffending.
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Lancashire Fire & Rescue and Regenda.
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Fleetwood Firework Extravaganza £10,296.87		
<b>Summary:</b>	Since 2009, The Rotary Club of Fleetwood has held an organised bonfire and firework display on the 5th November which has grown year on year. The Rotary Club would like funding to help cover the costs of the event.		
<b>Comments:</b>	The Rotary Club of Fleetwood work in partnership with Lancashire Constabulary, Lancashire Fire and Rescue and Wyre Council. Since running the event in 2009 figures show a decrease in anti-social behaviour and deliberate fires around Bonfire Night.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500 is provided to the Rotary Club of Fleetwood.</b>
