AREA:	West Division	PRIORITY:	Supporting Vulnerable People.
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,017	Match Funds:	Francis C Scott Trust, InKind and Venue contributions.
Project Name & Cost	Romeo Jones £6,727		
Summary:	Certain Curtain Theatre Company will run three weeks of performances during 'teenbuse awareness month' in October to secondary school pupils within Blackpool, Fylde, Wyre, Lancaster and Morecambe. The live theatre performance Romeo Jones examines the nature of abuse in teenage relationships exploring controlling and abusive behaviour. Certain Curtain Theatre Company will provide supporting information to schools for pre/post work to be undertaken.		
Comments:	Certain Curtain Theatre Company will advise young people where they can get support. The theatre group will work in partnership with support agencies, including Victim Support. The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner will contact the group to ensure they are providing information on NEST Lancashire.

AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£1,900	Match Funds:	Organisations own resources.
Project Name & Cost	Summer Sports Programme £2,000		
Summary:	Eastpines Park has suffered from high levels of Anti-Social Behaviour since the closure of the main park, Anchorholme. Friends of Eastpines Park will work in partnership with Sport Blackpool to deliver an established diversionary activities summer programme for young people during the holiday period.		
Comments:	The £1,900 funding from the Commissioner will allow the project to run through August 2017 and August 2018 and the Friendship group will run a refreshment stall throughout the programme in order to raise funds to make the project sustainable and continuing to run from 2019 onwards.		
Recommendation:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of £1,900 is provided to the Friends Of Eastpines Park conditional they submit their accounts and meet the criteria. 		

3. NAME:	Skem Creative Hub

Project Name & Cost	Positive Summer Activities Programme £4,250		
Summary:	Skem Creative Hub will offer free community sessions, 4 times per week to young people during the summer holidays. The sessions will give young people the opportunity to create their own works of art which will be showcased in the local shopping centre.		
Comments:	Skelmersdale is an area in Lancashire which suffers from high levels of Anti-Social Behaviour.

4. NAME:	Staining Junior Football Club

AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,400	Match Funds:	Organisations own resources.
Project Name & Cost	Staining 4 All £2,600		
Summary:	Staining JFC will run a diversionary activities programme, holding 3 sessions per week for 6 weeks covering the summer holiday period.		
Comments:	Staining JFC have a close working relationship with the Parish Council as well as the local Police Community Support Officer and have carried out a local consultation with youngsters in which feedback was received that there are no activities for young people aged 7-15 to take part in. The local PCSO will be able to refer vulnerable young people into the project.

5. NAME:	Tanterton Village Centre Limited

AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,230	Match Funds:	Places for People, CTS Shop Fitting & Sainsbury's.
Project Name & Cost	Summer Fun £3,954		
Summary:	Tanterton Village Centre will run a summer holiday programme to target and engage local young people at the risk of offending. Youngsters aged 7-11 will have the opportunity to take part in a variety of sporting, drama and art activities.		
Comments:	Tanterton Village Centre work in partnership with the Youth and Community Outreach Officer from the local housing association, Places for People and have managed to secure match funding towards this project.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of £2,230 to Tanterton Village Centre Limited for the Summer Fun project.		

6. NAME:	The Friends of Hope Street Park		
AREA:	Fylde	PRIORITY:	Tackle crime and reoffending.
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,400	Match Funds:	Organisations own resources.
Project Name & Cost	Hope Street Park Activity Festival £2,500		
Summary:	The Friends of Hope Street Park work in partnership with Fylde Community Safety Partnership and other partners and have developed a summer project delivery plan. Friends of Hope Street Park will run a four week activity programme, holding four sessions per week to local young people. The group will also hold a Family Fun Day which will give local families the opportunity to participate in community based sports and see what the park has to offer.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of £2,400 is provided to The Friends of Hope Street Park conditional they submit both their accounts and an evaluation for a project the Commissioner supported in August 2016.

AREA:	Preston	PRIORITY:	Unclear.
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,000	Match Funds:	Lancashire County Council & Local Businesses.
Project Name & Cost	Broadgate & District Magazine £4,200 per annum		
Details:	The Broadgate Residents Action Group produce and distribute a monthly magazine to each of the 1800 households and businesses in the area. The magazine includes Police statistics, business advertisements, comment pieces and puzzles. The group would like funding towards the cost of production.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that project does not clearly support the Commissioner's priorities.		

B. NAME:	Preston Rosettes Morris Dancing Group		
AREA:	Preston	PRIORITY:	Unclear.
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£1,750	Match Funds:	None.
Project Name & Cost	NDTO Season 2017 £1,750		
Details:	Preston Rosettes Morris Dancing Group practice once per week and participate in competitions around the North West. The Group would like funding towards transport costs so they do not have to raise the cost of attending, which could lead to girls leaving the club.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that project does not clearly support the Commissioner's priorities.		

C. NAME:	Skelmersdale Action for Youth (S.A.Y)		
AREA:	West Lancashire	PRIORITY:	Supporting vulnerable people and victims & Tackle crime & reoffending.
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,500	Match Funds:	Organisations own resources.
Project Name & Cost	STAND TOGETHER £5,000		
Details:	S.A.Y would like to run a Hate Crime conference for disability groups in West Lancashire in which they would work in partnership with Lancashire Police, CPS and support agencies. They would also run a crime prevention project in which they would post code mobile phones, iPads, bikes etc.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that the organisation does not meet the CAF criteria as: a) S.A.Y have more than 10k in unrestricted reserves. b) Have applied to the Community Action Fund within the last year.
