SUMMARY:	One of their main priorities will be to make early interventions with the young people to maintain their morale and good behaviour and reduce anti-social behaviour in the Farringdon Park and surrounding local area. Early intervention helps stop children becoming involved in crime by helping to address their unmet needs and vulnerabilities, reduces peer pressure and promotes positive outcomes. They will work to discourage a gang culture from developing by providing positive opportunities within a safe community centre for the youths to participate in. The aim is to prevent the youths from becoming involved in aggressive groups, take them away from a drink and drug culture developing in many communities and therefore reduce the amount of criminal activity such as bullying, graffiti, acts of violence and damage to vehicles and property.

SUMMARY:	LANPAC Their project will involve 2 key strands: 1) Early Prevention via detached youth work in the key wards: The detached youth work offer will provide early support to vulnerable children who have not yet had contact with the Youth Justice System and will be delivered by voluntary sector youth service providers. This will be carried out via the Boys and Girls Club who will provide the Youth Work Element. Targeted support will also be provided by the Blackpool Adolescent Service, Awaken and Community Safety Team. 2) Targeted Diversion via multi-agency partners:			

PRIORITY	Additional targeted support will be available for young people who have had some contact with the Criminal Justice System including children not linked to an offence but potentially on the cusp of offending and also children with an informal or formal disposal. Targeted support will include an offer of 1:1 support from the Adolescent Service Drug, Alcohol and Sexual Health practitioners, referrals to holistic whole family support via the Youth Justice Turnaround Programme or relevant Early Help service, bespoke interventions from Community Safety and Awaken Exploitation team – such as hot spots, target hardening, disruption, welfare checks and consultation with young people - All of which feeds directly into Daily Exploitation Meetings and Risk Management Meetings.
