### Sponsorship, gifts, and loans 2023/24

### **Executive Summary**

Under Section 93 of the Police Act 1996, a Police Authority may, in connection with the discharge of its functions, accept gifts of money and gifts or loans of other property, on such terms as appear to the Authority to be appropriate. The terms on which gifts or loans are accepted may allow commercial sponsorship of some police force activities.

The total value of gifts, loans and sponsorship accepted should not exceed a maximum equivalent value of 1% of the Force budget annually (£3.43m in 2023/24). Provided it remains below this figure, the PCC can assume that the value of gifts, loans and sponsorship will be discounted for the purposes of calculating Government grants to the PCC.

The value of gifts, loans, and sponsorship during the 2023/24 financial year was £351,502.32 (£47,664.64 in 2022/23).

All sponsorship, gifts and loans received fall within the guidelines set out in the Sponsorship, Gifts and Loans policy.

### PART I

### 1. Background and Advice

### 1.1. Sponsorship, Gifts and Loans 2023/24

Under Section 93 of the Police Act 1996, a Police Authority may, in connection with the discharge of its functions, accept gifts of money and gifts or loans of other property, on such terms as appear to the Authority to be appropriate. The terms on which gifts or loans are accepted may allow commercial sponsorship of some police force activities.

The total value of gifts, loans and sponsorship accepted should not exceed a maximum equivalent value of 1% of the Force budget annually (£3.43m in 2023/24). Provided it remains below this figure, the PCC can assume that the value of gifts, loans and sponsorship will be discounted for the purposes of calculating Government grants to the PCC.

The PCC is now informed that the value of gifts, loans, and sponsorship during the 2023/24 financial year was £351,502.32 (£47,664.64 in 2022/23).

All sponsorship, gifts and loans received fall within the guidelines set out in the Sponsorship, Gifts and Loans policy.

Although individual sums received during the year varied, the following indicate areas where significant contributions were received.

## 1.2. Lancashire Partnership Against Crime (LANPAC)

Contributions totalling £42,911.12 were received from LANPAC to support a number of Community Safety Initiatives across the Constabulary. The individual amounts awarded were based on bids from Divisions and Departments to LANPAC.

### 1.3. West Division

£950 was provided by multiple hotels to fund a sponsorship led operation called Op Screecher, an operation targeted at motorcycle safety during the Isle of Man TT.

### 1.4. South Division

Outside of LANPAC funding, no extra sponsorship, gifts, or loans were received.

### 1.5. East Division

- £1,000 of matched funding was provided by Ribble Valley Borough Council towards bike marking kits in rural areas.
- £175 was provided by Blackburn with Darwen Council as matched funding for bike marking kits, to be provided at events in Bank Top and Audley
- £43,000 was provided by Blackburn with Darwen Council, to be used towards drug partnership operations across the East area.

### 1.6. HQ

- £750 was received from a member of the public for the purchase of a new police dog.
- Donations have been received towards the police museum (£1,466.20) and we received sums from sponsors for the Excellence Awards (£12,100).
- £250,000 was received from the Premier League as a <u>one-off</u> unconditional gift. The NPCC lead for football has suggested that this should be used towards the cost of policing football matches. Whilst it has currently been placed in reserves it is proposed that it is used towards the cost of replacing one of the two horse boxes that are coming to end of life (estimated cost c£0.3m each).
